Operating Student-Run Businesses in the CTE Pathways

Interested in starting or ramping up a school store as a fundraiser for your school/club? These sessions will provide an in-depth look into *FOUR* successful school store operations. Each session will delve into a different type of store and will discuss scheduling, merchandise, vendors, equipment, as well as start-up tips.

Maize High Spirit Central, presented by Dan Loving Maize High School, Room E9 Business Management and Entrepreneurship Pathway

This session will provide an in-depth look into utilizing a school store as an Applied Business Development course in the Business Management and Entrepreneurship Pathway. Learn how we operate a successful school store operation, Maize High Spirit Central. We will discuss scheduling, regulations, merchandise, vendors, equipment, and security as well as touring our school store.

The Landing Coffee Shop, *presented by* Shanna Zimmerman Maize Career Academy, Room 120 Marketing Pathway

This session will provide an overview of the school based enterprise operations at Wichita High School East. Marketing students at East run a coffee shop, The Landing, and also retail official school apparel both in the shop and online. We will discuss product selection and vendors for the coffee shop, student managers and managing students, strategies for selling apparel products, and certification opportunities through DECA.

General Store at Reflection Ridge Retirement Home, presented by Michelle Hilliard

Maize Career Academy - Room 120 Business Management and Entrepreneurship Pathway

This session will provide an overview of the start-up and funding process for the General Store at a local retirement home. Participants will learn about the day-to-day operations, from the operating system used to the involvement of students in the overall process. Students will be present and operating the store, giving participants an inside glimpse of how students open the store each day and their interaction with the residents of the home.

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Campus HS Coffee Shop, *presented by* Zac Kliewer Campus HS, Stompin' Grounds Coffee Shop Business, Marketing, and Entrepreneurship Pathways

This session will include a guide on how to start your own student-run business (coffee shop), the steps taken to get stakeholders on board, and how to run and operate the shop and class. Participants will take away a business plan, PowerPoint on how to create a business, barista knowledge and skills, and some always needed caffeine!
